1	[HS2002] Chapter 91	Clocks and watches	Member A calculates tariffs on finished clocks and watches as the aggregate of the tariffs on their components. This forms a trade barrier, since these calculations are complex and the administrative procedures are burdensome. For example, under the current rules, the tariff on a wristwatch is the total of the tariffs on its: (a) movement; (b) case; (c) strap, band or bracelet; and (d) battery. Thus, when a company exports a finished wristwatch to Member A, it must identify its components and then calculate the total tariffs of each component: the movement, case, band and battery.	government of Member A abolish such administration and simply set duties under a 6-digit HS code, instead of the component price break	No notification has been made previously regarding these measures.

In addition, the ways of marking, such as imprinting and tags, are elaborately provided in the Act.
