# RECENTLY ACCEDED MEMBERS

Communication from Ecuador and Panama

The following communication, dated 2 June 2006, is being circulated at the request of the delegations of Ecuador and Panama.

#### I. BACKGROUND

The reference paper of the Chairman of the Special Session of the Committee on Agriculture of 4 May 2006, concerning the issue of "Recently Acceded Members", mentions among its main aspects the need to define the list of those Members considered as recently acceded.

In his reference paper, the Chairman identifies the special characteristics of Recently Acceded Members when pointing out in paragraph 7 that "one common feature is that it would appear that they had to take on extensive commitments in order to accede to the WTO." It has been stated that these commitments are much broader than those assumed by other Members during the Uruguay Round of negotiations. As a result, the tariff averages are much lower (see the tariff profile review and the dates of application for the Members that entered the WTO since the beginning of the application of the results of the Uruguay Round).

Finally, the Chairman considers that "...this particular aspect of the Doha Development Agenda is perhaps more a matter, in formal terms, for bodies other than this Negotiating Group *per se* to resolve. This for present purposes is without prejudice to that formal issue."

#### II. CENTRAL POSITION OF ECUADOR AND PANAMA

Ecuador and Panama have insisted on the fact that in light of the broad commitments assumed in terms of market access in their accession processes to the WTO they consider themselves Recently Acceded Members and, therefore, subject to the flexibilities to be agreed in these negotiations, recognized in paragraph 47 of Annex A and in paragraph 11 of Annex B of the General Council Decision of 1 August 2004 contained in document WT/L/579 and later confirmed in paragraph 58 of the Hong Kong Ministerial Declaration.

#### III. MAIN JUSTIFICATIONS

The charts first presented by the Chairman of the Committee on Market Access and later by the Chairman of the Special Session of the Committee on Agriculture clearly show the level of the commitments assumed by Ecuador and Panama in our accession processes to the WTO, as well as the WT/GC/W/565 TN/AG/W/2 TN/MA/W/73 Page 2

commitments assumed by Members that acceded at later dates. It can be observed in these charts that there is no major difference for such commitments, which is the basis for the objective criteria of our position.

Ecuador and Panama strongly consider that the criteria to define the list of Recently Acceded Members is determined by the broad levels of commitments assumed in the accession processes to which these Members were subjected and that are clearly outlined in the charts prepared by the WTO Secretariat.

It cannot be justified in any way that developing countries such as Ecuador and Panama be excluded from this list since our commitments are higher than those of many Members that participated in the Uruguay Round negotiations.

Ecuador and Panama, together with those Members that entered the WTO after the Uruguay Round, did not have the opportunity to participate in any previous multilateral negotiation and, therefore, it would be highly discriminatory that we be excluded from any flexibility agreed in this Round of negotiations.

An additional general characteristic of Recently Acceded Members is that they have been implementing accession commitments during a large part of the Doha Round of multilateral negotiations.

Ecuador and Panama are willing to positively contribute to the development of modalities for Recently Acceded Members.
